From the President's Desk....

Here we are between summer and autumn in Cass County, Nebraska. I recall that my father referred to this as "Goldenrod" season and my mother thought of it as "Wild Aster" season. They were both right, of course but I sided with my father as he told us about the significance of the Goldenrod plant. Honey Bees, now endangered, thrive on Goldenrod as well as Wild Asters. Rich in nectar, both plants produce excellent bee honey. Native Americans taught our pioneers to use Goldenrod to dye cloth for brightly colored blankets and clothing and taught them that Goldenrod was an all-purpose herb with medicinal qualities. Although very rich with pollen Goldenrod is not an allergy culprit. The pollen is so heavy that it falls to the ground rather than blowing into the wind. Goldenrod and Wild Asters are growing profusely right now in Cass County and the Golden color of our state flower, the Goldenrod, is further enhanced by the purple of the Asters growing nearby. So in the end both parents were correct, both plants have their attributes.

It was during that Goldenrod/Aster season that each year my parents would take us on a Sunday adventure, a trip to a relatively unknown and hidden place that we named Lost Lake. The lake was actually part of an old limestone quarry. It was there that we hiked through the adjacent woods to pick pawpaws and to gather black walnuts. Following that ritual we built a bonfire where we roasted hot dogs and marshmallows. My brother and I would then explore the area around the lake for rocks and fossils. We usually found something interesting but one year my brother found a fossilized tooth which was about 1 1/2" long, apparently from a large ancient shark. He usually found the best fossils because he is three years older than I and I was always too busy skipping rocks across the lake or catching frogs. Some things never change!!

Although the Cass County Museum is primarily a Pioneer History museum, we do have a collection of geological items which are sometimes displayed. A museum member has purchased some fossils that we will be giving to children during this year's Halloween parade on October 27. Maybe the fossils will inspire some of the children to become archeologists or geologists, or maybe they will remain content in skipping rocks and catching frogs!!!. We'll hope for the best.

Enjoy this transitional season in our wonderful county in this great state of Nebraska and please stop in to our museum as often as you can. We appreciate your support.

Cass County Historical Society, organized in 1936, is dedicated to a mission of telling the history of Cass County since 1854, the year the county was opened for settlement. The Society's first permanent displays were housed in two rooms on the third floor of the Cass County Courthouse. In 1960, the present museum was opened at 646 Main Street in Plattsmouth.

Approximately one third of the museum's budget comes from the County. The rest of the financial support is from Memberships, Donations, Gift Shop Sales, Memorials and Grants.
