From the President's Desk....

Last week as I attended the annual banquet of the Nebraska Hall of Agricultural Achievement, I was reminded of the many Cass Countians (or near Cass Countians) that have contributed much to Nebraska history and particularly to Cass County agriculture. At risk of missing many, I am reminded of Isaac Pollard,Isaac Wiles,Addison Erwin Sheldon,Willard Waldo,Jerome Warner,Charles Warner,Charles Marshal,Ralph Raikes,Ted Doane, Parr Young, and Harry Knabe, to name just a few. (these were all past honorees of the Hall Of Agricultural Achievement or The Block And Bridal Club.)

Many early historic events occurred in Cass County and many local individuals were contributors. Because there are so many more, I hope we can expand and promote this list of pioneer families, with recognition in the future at our Museum. Another area of early county activities by several families was livestock feeding, particularly cattle. Because of our proximity to the Omaha Stockyards and the meat packing industry, we were a significant cattle production area. Many farms had cattle and Sunday night was a heavy shipping time to go to Omaha to hit the Monday market. Trucks would be lined up on L street as far west as 72nd street. As first hand memory fades about the 1940's 50's and 60's, we need to pass this history to our present and future citizens ,which is really the goal of the CCHS. Another part of our culture that is now lost is the Saturday night shopping and social night. Towns' Main Streets across the county would be full and stores would be busy. Eggs and cream brought to town would pay for the groceries, and neighbors would visit into the night. Because most kids went to one room country schools, it was their chance to become acquainted also. "Backstopping" all this is the large numbers of pioneer (100 years) farm family ownership awards and the Legacy (150 years) award that are in Cass County. These awards are sponsored by the Aksarben Foundation and the Nebraska Farm Bureau. These awards honor farm families for their continuous years of farm ownership of at least 40 acres or more. They are presented annually at the Cass County Fair in August. You can find the application on the Aksarben Webb site. They are due April 15.

Cass County Historical Society, organized in 1936, is dedicated to a mission of telling the history of Cass County since 1854, the year the county was opened for settlement. The Society's first permanent displays were housed in two rooms on the third floor of the Cass County Courthouse. In 1960, the present museum was opened at 646 Main Street in Plattsmouth. Approximately one third of the museum's budget comes from the County. The rest of the financial support is from Memberships, Donations, Gift Shop Sales, Memorials and Grants.
