From the President's Desk....

As I sat in the farm building recently amid the many many artifacts we have at the Cass County Museum, I am reminded of how many years of history are covered in our displays. Cass County was definitely a home for several native Americans, going back to early historical times. Many of our displays convey that message, thanks to many donor collections over the years.

With the coming of the European settlers, production agriculture began in earnest in Nebraska and Cass County. As the prairie was broken (e.g. Prairie Jake Vallery) and cultivated, new tools and machines were constantly being invented, many of which are represented in our museum.

Advancement in household appliances is also indicated, as manual methods gave way to electricity. Sometimes it is hard to believe the ingenuity and practicality our forebears used in their daily lives. I am also amazed at the fragility of some the farm machinery. It is no wonder a runaway horse could cause so much damage and even death. Much of what I am talking about can be seen in the farm building and farm shed. However we have much more that is not on display because of lack of room. We do have on display two very early tractors, a 1927 John Deere "D" used by a Cass County farmer, and 1938 Farmall "F-20".

We are also trying to increase our viewing hours on weekends, by having more open houses. Volunteers have helped us greatly in this regard and attendance has increased. THANK YOU.

In addition to the museum, we have the Cook log cabin, a Burlington caboose, and a Lewis and Clark pirogue at the end of Main Street . You will also want to "discover" about the spat between Nehawka and Plattsmouth about an 1860s 880 pound cannon that originally came from Battle Creek.

Please consider this as an "updated" invitation to come and view our history and displays, several of which are updated monthly.



August 27, 9:00 a.m and 1:00 p.m. "John Colter and the American Fur Trade" presented by Sterling Fichter



Cass County Historical Society, organized in 1936, is dedicated to a mission of telling the history of Cass County since 1854, the year the county was opened for settlement. The Society's first permanent displays were housed in two rooms on the third floor of the Cass County Courthouse. In 1960, the present museum was opened at 646 Main Street in Plattsmouth. Approximately one third of the museum's budget comes from the County. The rest of the financial support is from Memberships, Donations, Gift Shop Sales, Memorials and Grants.
