Mission Statement:


The Cass County Historical Society shall collect, preserve, and study materials to document, interpret and present the history of Cass County Nebraska to the public.

From the President's Desk....

As I mentioned in the Fall Newsletter, we have decided to move ahead with plans for major renovation and expansion of the museum. We have been quietly working with some possible major donors and have already some significant amounts. The Board is fully committed to this growth and expansion to our museum. We have had the proceeds from the sale of land donated by Dr. John Gilmore since 2000 and have decided that the time is to do it now or forget it. That \$1 million has grown to \$1,200,000 now and we have since added to it. We also had a bequest from him that established a Perpetual Endowment Fund totaling \$1,700,000. The principal cannot be used, but the interest can be used for operating funds which will help to maintain and preserve our future.

We will soon be launching a broad financial drive for all who are interested in supporting and remembering our heritage, particularly our rural and small town culture in Cass County. (We must show local support before foundations are interested.). We definitely need more display and storage area. The proposed architectural plan is for a two story addition, approximately doubling our present facility. Various levels of giving will be recognized, as well as naming rights for individual projects. It is our hope that many pioneer families in the county would want to proudly remember and display their individual pioneer history which would be shown in display panels, as well as in book form.

Did you know that there are 21,588 history organizations in the United States?

The American Association for State and Local History just released the results of their 2022 National Census of History Organizations. It revealed a total of 21,588 history organizations(that's more than the number of Walmarts, McDonalds, Starbucks and public libraries.)

Cass County Historical Society, organized in 1936, is dedicated to a mission of telling the history of Cass County since 1854, the year the county was opened for settlement. The Society's first permanent displays were housed in two rooms on the third floor of the Cass County Courthouse. In 1960, the present museum was opened at 646 Main Street in Plattsmouth. Approximately one third of the museum's budget comes from the County. The rest of the financial support is from Memberships, Donations, Gift Shop Sales, Memorials and Grants.
